## Notes from Fr Nick.....December 12, 2021

Happy Gaudete Sunday! Gaudete is Latin for 'rejoice'! It reflects the joy we should feel in our hearts as our Messiah is drawing close, now that we are more than half way through Advent. That is also why we light the rose candle and wear rose vestments on this day. But while we are urged to recognize that joy within us, we are also reminded that there is an urgency to continue to prepare a place in our hearts and in our lives for Jesus to dwell at Christmas. If we don't take the time to prepare, Christmas will not be any more special than any other day of the year. May we heed John the Baptist's call and 'Prepare ye the way of the Lord!'

They are meeting to plan how to merge budgets and charts of accounts. While the financial piece is confidential, they will be reaching out to the Building & Grounds committees of each of our parishes for input into what capital is needed for improvements/maintenance of our facilities.

Each of these committees will be looking to expand its membership to provide everyone with the chance to have input into the formation of our new parish.
