GIFTS

Gifts are everywhere at this time of year. Christmas gifts. Hostess gifts. Hidden gifts. Wrong-size gifts. Unexpected gifts. Unwanted gifts. Unreciprocated gifts. And in to-day's readings we hear about even more gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But we know intuitively (or, one hopes, eventually!) that gifts are symbols of something much deeper and less tangible. The gift of God's Son is, of course, at the heart of our Christmas festivities. We are not—and never—alone, because "God is with us." (Thus the name Emmanuel.) But wait, that's not all! The liturgy reminds us over and over that this is a "holy exchange." As Christ came to share in our humanity, we come to share in his divinity. The full significance of that mystery is a gift we have yet to unwrap completely.

WHAT KIND OF GOD IS THIS?

Christmas is a season of abundance. Christmas cookies and carols. Parties and presents. Mangers and mistletoe. The same is true in our church. Within a period of nine days we celebrate Christmas, the Holy Family, Mary Mother of God, and today the Solemnity of the Epiphany. Truly an embarrassment of liturgical riches. (And we are not finished yet!)

However, for many people, Christmas is already over. Trees litter the curbside or make their way back to the attic. Presents are put away or returned. We prepare to go back to school or work. But as Christians we have barely dipped our toes into the profound mystery of a God who walks among us. What kind of a God is this whose kingdom is not limited by our borders, fears, expectations, or imaginations? Today's psalm reminds us, "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." Diversity and inclusion are not new to God's agenda.

TRADITIONS UNCOVER MEANING

Two traditional rituals, one liturgical and one domestic, help underline the meaning of the Epiphany. The Proclamation of the Date of Easter is an option for inclusion at Mass today. This text which formally announces the dates of the upcoming major feast days reminds us that Christmas is best honored in the context of the whole story of salvation that culminates in Easter. Or as writer Nathan Mitchell reflects, the wood of the crib becomes the wood of the cross.

The second tradition connected to Epiphany is the blessing of the door of one's home with chalk. It includes a prayer for protection for all who enter therein. One explanation of this tradition ties it to the Passover in the Book of Exodus: the marking of

the doorposts with the blood of the lamb kept the Israelites safe. This tradition too offers a connection between Christmas and Easter.

As we continue to mine the richness of this season we hum along with the angels, Gloria in excelsis Deo!



FAQS: Building a new Parish from Incarnation and Christ the King

Q: Will the parishes of Christ the King and Incarnation be merged to create a new, combined parish?

A: As of January 1, 2022, Fr Nick will be pastor of both Christ the King and Incarnation. He will be the pastor of the new combined parish. We are hoping that the official merger of the two parishes will be effective by July 1, 2022.

Q: Why are the parishes being merged?
A: To reflect changing realities of diminishing church attendance combined with a shortage of priests. The merger is designed as an important first step to better position our local church to meet the current & future needs of Wethersfield.

Q: What is the vision for the merger? A: To establish a new, vibrant, welcoming, dynamic and growing parish, one which loves and honors God, respects, loves and welcomes all people, & makes disciples who change the world.

Q: What will be the name of the new combined parish?

A: To be determined. When Corpus Christi, Sacred Heart and St. Luke merged into Christ the King in 2017, we knew the possibility of further consolidation existed. And so while it makes sense to see this merger as having Incarnation join with Corpus Christi, Sacred Heart and St. Luke as Christ the King, and while it makes sense from a legal and canonical perspective as well, the Transition Team will have input into the final decision.

Q: Will the name of our churches change? A: No. The names of the church buildings will remain the same, and will be used to identify the campus locations that form the one combined Parish.

Q: Will the churches of Christ the King and Incarnation remain open?

A: Yes. Both church buildings will remain open. Each church building will be a campus of the combined Parish. The current Mass schedules at each church will continue for 2022, but will be streamlined for 2023.

Q: What priests will staff the new parish?
A: We will be fortunate to have three priests ministering during 2022. Fr. Nick will be the Pastor. Fr. Moran will be the Senior Parochial Vicar, and Fr. George will be the Parochial Vicar. Fr. Moran will retire in February 2023, at which time only Fr. Nick & Fr. George will serve our new Parish.

Q: Which church(es) will be available for sacraments and funerals?

A: Sacramental life will be available at Corpus Christi, Incarnation, and Sacred Heart churches.

Q: Will offices at both campuses remain open? A: Yes, for now. As the merger evolves and progresses, office hours, availability, and locations will be developed to ensure the best possible service to our new parish community.

Q: What happens to the parishes' financial resources? A: The financial resources of both parishes will be combined, and the Finance Councils, along with Archdiocesan guidance, will provide oversight of these processes.

Q: What other changes can we expect?
A: The merger will entail a number of 'behind- thescenes' as well as more visible issues. For example,
the Transition Team is serving as the Pastoral Council for the immediate time, and we will then hold an
election to create a new Pastoral Council. The Finance Councils of both parishes are already meeting
to prepare budgets for 2022. Because we have not
legally merged yet, separate budgets need to be prepared, but in doing them together, they are anticipat-

ing one joint budget going forward.

The Faith Formation programs have merged for Middle and High School, and the Elementary School programs will merge for the Fall of 2022. Mens' and Womens' groups, Social Action, and Building Committees are already joining forces as well. The intent is to have stronger and more efficient sustainable resources to carry us into the future. Pastoral, administrative and ministry functions will be streamlined to more efficiently serve and support the combined parish.

Q: Where can I find updated merger information? A: The Transition Team has a Communications Committee. They will be sharing information via the bulletin, the websites, Facebook (facebook.com/ChristtheKingCT), email, and announcements at Mass. The Epiphany of the Lord

JOURNEY TOWARD GOD

In our celebration of the

Epiphany, two interwoven themes are present in the readings today. God is beginning something new, and God gathers all of humanity to participate. For Isaiah, God's bright light, manifested in the people of Israel, attracts and summons people from many nations to Jerusalem. In the letter to the Ephesians, God's grace makes the Gentiles coheirs and co-partners in the gospel. Matthew tells the story of the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel through the birth of Jesus, and simultaneously leading foreigners to share in these same promises. With the birth of Jesus, God chose a particular people, in a particular time and place, to enter most directly into the human story. Today's readings teach that God did this in order to gather all people, all cultures, into unity with God. Like the magi, we are drawn into a journey toward God, becoming co-partners in God's work.

Pastor's Corner – January 2, 2022

Who were those wanderers who, unimpressed by King Herod, did homage to a newborn babe and allowed an angel to change their travel plans? Our crèche sets, carols and myths tell us they numbered three - an idea deduced from the gifts Matthew mentions - but there's no reason to think that there were not more of them: more people and more gifts.

By tradition, they are called kings. If so, probably no more than ourselves who are baptized as priests, prophets and kings. Better we call them the Magi, a title that hints at mystery, magic and miracles.

Historians say it's unlikely that their story reflects any verifiable event. For us, more important than historical fact is the reason Matthew made this part of his Gospel.

First of all, Matthew borrowed key details for his story from Isaiah's prophecies. Isaiah assures the people who have been in darkness that the light of God's glory will shine on them and that their faith will attract people from afar who will come bearing gifts. With that, we have the background for the star, the travelers, the camels and the gifts: all signs of the advent of God's salvation.

Matthew is commenting on Isaiah and portraying Jesus as the fulfillment of ancient hopes. He begins his Gospel with Jesus, Emmanuel, endangered among his own people and revered by representatives of the Gentile world. Then he ends his Gospel with Christ's command to make disciples of all the nations and the promise that as our Emmanuel, he will remain with us until the end.

What does this narrative mean for us today as we begin the year 2022? Perhaps in these uncertain times (will COVID-19 ever end, what will our new parish become?) the Magi can be our guides. More than the time and money required for their journey, they possessed a key combination of self-confidence and desire for more meaning in life. These attitudes urged them to read the signs of the times and to venture into the unknown. They humbly believed there was more wisdom in the world than they had yet discovered. Thus, they set off in a caravan that became the first Christian pilgrimage.

As we begin this new year we too are setting off, as the Catholic community in Wethersfield on a pilgrimage that will bring us together as one parish. God is leading us where we need to go, if we but follow His star, if we but have the courage to read the signs of the times and venture into the unknown.

Back on December 19th, we included in the bulletin an insert with Frequently Asked Questions concerning the transition process. It is available on the websites of both Christ the King and Incarnation Parishes. We also now have a dedicated email address for you to submit questions, comments, concerns or suggestions to the Transition Committee (incarnation.ctk@gmal.com).

I am excited by the possibilities given us for the future of our Church in Wethersfield. I am appreciative of the energy and enthusiasm of our Transition Team. And I look forward to joining you on this journey as together we build the Father's Kingdom of true and lasting peace.
