PRAYER CORNER

THEOPHANIES

Today's readings recount three theophanies, or particular manifestations of God's presence. The prophet Isaiah is caught up in a dramatic scene of heavenly worship, with a royal throne, burning embers, and sera-

phim singing, "Holy, holy, holy." Isaiah is overwhelmed. In the responsorial psalm, the assembly adds its own worship to that of the seraphim: "In the sight of the angels, I will sing your praises, Lord" (Psalm 138:1).

Paul reminds the Corinthians of his own experience of a post-Resurrection appearance of the Lord, making him an apostle, but one "born abnormally" (1 Corinthians 15:8), since he had no acquaintance with the earthly Jesus. The first of those who did know the earthly Jesus were surprised by fishing advice from the teacher who had commandeered Simon's boat, resulting in an extraordinary catch. Although less colorful than those of Isaiah or Paul, this theophany was just as overwhelming.

(1 Corinthians 15:1-11 [3-8, 11]).

Gospel — Jesus directs Simon to take his boat into deep water for a miraculous catch of fish. Simon and his partners leave all to follow Jesus (Luke 5:1-11).

Pastor's Corner - February 6, 2022

In our daily readings at Mass from the 2nd Book of Samuel a week or so ago, we heard these words from King David when he realized how the Lord was blessing him: 'Who am I, Lord God, and who are the members of my house that you have brought me to this point?'

In my homily based on that reading I said it shows us the difference between cats and dogs. People who know me know that I **am** slightly prejudiced because I am a dog lover and definitely not a cat lover.

But, think what cats are like. When you feed a cat, pet a cat, care for a cat, and love a cat the cat concludes that it must be god.

Dogs on the other hand are different. When you feed a dog, pet a dog, care for a dog, and love a dog the dog concludes that **you** must be god. Am I right?

Now, whether or not you agree with this very researched, proven, and scientific data I just shared with you, there **is** a profound lesson in it. The Bible, from front to back, presents to us a view of man that is much more **cat-like** than **dog-like**.

By nature we tend to think like this, 'God created the heavens and the earth just for me, all the stories in the Bible are just about me, Christ came to earth just for me, to suffer just for me, to die just for me, and has gone back to heaven to wait just for me.

Therefore, since God did all of this for me, God must love **me** more than He loves anything else, and since God loves me more than anything else I am going to love Him just because He loves me so much.'

What King David showed us, the conclusion **he** came to, is that when it comes to our relationship with God, **humility** must be front and center.

God **does** love each one of us – not more than anything else, but the **same** as everything else. **But**, we did nothing to earn this love.

It was simply freely and unconditionally given to us. And so our only response must be to love Him, and all of His creation, in the very same way – freely and unconditionally, whether anyone else deserves it or not, whether anyone else can repay it or not.

May we always and everywhere go about our days seeking ways to share that love with everyone whose path will cross ours, and thus help to build the Father's Kingdom of true and lasting peace.
