### PRAYER CORNER

#### LOVE AS GOD LOVES

Our Gospel today continues Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, in which we heard Luke's version of the Beatitudes.

This week, Jesus gives us new "commandments," telling us how to live and act in the world as his disciples, rooted in the radical love of God for humanity. It reminds us of his later speech about loving one another as he loves us, in other words with a God-like love, the kind we see in today's psalm about God's mercy. How else could we do as Jesus tells us by loving our enemies, which seems impossible, until we remember that God gave us the example of Jesus, who is like God but also like us? David understands this merciful love when he spares the life of his enemy in the first reading. Finally, Paul tells us that we will become like Jesus if we act as he did, as God does.

#### Pastor's Corner - February 20, 2022

Normally at this time of the year, I present the Annual Report of the parish in conjunction with my homily at the weekend Mass. This year presents a unique set of challenges, not the least of which is I am pastor of **two** parishes, and although we have begun the process of merging, for the calendar year 2021 each parish was totally separate and thus there are two separate reports required by the Archdiocese. And since it would be impossible for me to deliver the Annual Report in person at all 6 Masses because the times overlap, I thought it best to present a written report instead.

You will notice in today's bulletin an insert. On one side is an overview of the finances of our parish for 2021. The Finance Council and Trustees have been extremely helpful in maintaining our finances, and preparing this report. Should there be any questions, feel free to contact me or anyone from the Finance Council. We would be more than happy to provide clarification for you.

Some highlights from the report: Offertory was up - even though we were still dealing with the pandemic, you began to return for Mass. Thank you for your continued support of our parish. Total income was up significantly, in large part because of a large gift, and the PPP loan. Even though ordinary expenses were up almost \$100K, we still ended the year with a surplus of over \$45K, thanks to the oversight of our staff and Finance Council. If you got a raise at work this year, we would ask if you would consider increasing your offertory by the same percentage, so that we might balance our budget in 2022.

On the other side of the insert is a list of statistics from our parish. Again, if you have questions, feel free to contact the parish office.

Some highlights from this report: The number of families on our census dropped by almost 200, the number of individuals by 300, and the number of children by 1000.

While we send out over 1300 envelopes, only 156 (basket and online) were returned.

In the latest statistics released by the Archdiocese following the 2021 'October Count', Incarnation ranked 59th out of our 128 parishes in attendance at weekend Mass (487). However, that constitutes only  $\underline{12\%}$  of our registered parishioners!

People ask why we are merging parishes throughout the Archdiocese - there is the reason plain and simple. One of our primary tasks has to be to bring people back to worship with us each and every week. We need to share with our families and friends what a gift we have in being strengthened weekly by Jesus in Word and Sacrament, and invite them to 'come and see' for themselves! 2021 was a year of surprises. If nothing else, it shows very clearly that we are not in control - that it is God who is in control - and so it is in our best interest to turn things over to Him, to follow where He leads, and to unite our minds and hearts with Him at all times. The more we can do that, the easier life will be.

We survived two more strains of COVID, and pray that there won't be more coming. We began the process of merging into one faith community – a process that is happening throughout our Archdiocese. We formed a Transition Team comprised of five members from Incarnation that Fr. Moran named and five members from Christ the King that I invited. We have met regularly and together with Deacon McCormack from the Archdiocesan Pastoral Planning Office, are bringing together ministries in both parishes. We meet again this coming Monday.

The Finance Councils prepared budgets for 2022 with an eye toward having one budget when the merge becomes official. Our goal is for that to happen on July 1<sup>st</sup>. The Buildings and Grounds Committees have met and shared infrastructure needs of both campuses. Our Liturgy Committees met jointly to plan the coming Lent/Easter seasons. Our Faith Formation program, having merged the middle school and high school programs last Fall, merged the Elementary grades in January. And our school community at Corpus Christi School continues to flourish. We have one of the largest schools in the Archdiocese, and we owe a world of thanks to our dedicated staff, faculty & parents who sacrifice to provide a Catholic education to our children.

In January, I was named Pastor of Incarnation in addition to Christ the King. Fr. Moran was named Senior Parochial Vicar and Fr. George Parochial Vicar of both parishes. Two weeks later, the Archdiocese moved Fr. George to Branford and we welcomed Fr. Zach to our parishes.

As I ponder the coming year and the possibilities it has, I cannot help but see the connection with the 6<sup>th</sup> chapter of St Luke's gospel (Jesus' Sermon on the Plain) from which we heard at Mass both last weekend and this weekend, and will hear again next weekend. Jesus has gathered those who wish to follow him and he taught them what brings us blessedness versus what brings us woe. What brings us blessedness, what draws us closer to God, is our willingness to be other-centered. And, on the flip side, what brings us woe is our persistent self-centeredness, putting ourselves and our needs before the needs of others.

As I reflect on both of our parish communities here in Wethersfield, I am awed by the tremendous amount of outreach that has become part of the fabric of who we are. The many ways we reach out to those most in need in the world around us is indicative of just how blessed we are. As we look to unite our efforts I can only imagine the possibilities that lie before us as we continue to do the work of the Lord. May He truly bless all of our efforts!
