

LENTEN CONFESSIONS

What a gift — the gift of divine forgiveness! This Lenten season, the Archdiocese of Hartford is continuing an Archdiocesan-wide effort to inspire Catholics to experience God's love and mercy offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lenten confessions will be offered Mondays during Lent from 6:30-7:30pm at Incarnation Church.

Easter Communion Regulation: Catholics are obliged to receive Communion at least once between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday.

Lenten Mass Schedule: During Lent daily Mass at Incarnation Church will be held at 9am Monday-Friday excluding Holy Thursday, Good Friday & Holy Saturday.

Christ the King Parish will celebrate daily mass during Lent at 7:30am at Corpus Christi Church. <u>Christ the King Parish</u> will celebrate Saturday morning Mass during Lent at 7:30am at Corpus Christi Church.



Lenten Regulations: Catholics ages 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent. The rule does not apply when health or ability ABSTINENCE to work would be seriously impacted. Catholics who have celebrated their

18th birthday, but have not yet marked their 59th are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to individual needs but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

PRAYER CORNER

WE ARE KNOWN BY OUR FRUIT

This week, Jesus tells us that we must examine our own inner selves, our attitudes and dispositions, virtues and faults, rather than judging others. What is in our hearts comes out in what and how

we speak. If our hearts are filled with kindness and compassion, those qualities will be evident in our speaking, just as beautiful, wholesome fruit comes only from healthy trees. And vice-versa. The Wisdom writer Sirach in the first reading agrees with this concept—that we will be judged by our words. Paul reminds us that the reward of discipleship is eternal life. Today's psalm of thanksgiving and praise reminds us of God's kindness and faithfulness, which we are to emulate in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We are known, each of us, by our own fruit.

Pastor's Corner - February 27, 2022

Someone sent in the question recently asking whether our *Prayer For Our Community* "is even a prayer". Unfortunately the questioner did not leave a name so we could have a conversation about what prayer really is vs how they view prayer. (Yes, this prayer was written by Franciscan Fr. Richard Rohr, and it speaks eloquently to what is taking place in our minds and hearts as we move forward with this transition.)

On Wednesday we begin the holy season of Lent, and one of the focuses of this season is prayer (along with fasting and almsgiving). And so we would be wise to ask ourselves up front what we think prayer is, and then to reassess what this idea says about our view of and relationship with God.

I came across the following from Franciscan theologian Ilia Delio recently. She writes: "Prayer is the longing of the human heart for God. It is a yearning and desire for relationship with God, and it is God's attention to our desire: God-in-communion with us. St. Augustine of Hippo captured the longing of the human heart in the beginning of his Confessions: 'You have made us for yourself, and our heart is restless until it rests in you.'

"We long for God because we are created by God, and this longing is both the source of our hope in God and the very thing we resist. Prayer is an awakening to the fact that the fulfillment of my life lies in God.

God delights in creation and loves each of us with a personal love. Prayer, therefore, is God's desire to breathe in me, to be the spirit of my life, to draw me into the fullness of life. When I pray - when I breathe with God - I become part of the intimacy of God's life.

"To pray is to open up oneself to God who dwells within us. It means holding back nothing from God and sharing everything with God. . . . Only the grace of God can enable us to let go of our fears and allow God to be the God of our lives. True prayer is fundamental for life in God. It is that grace of conversion that opens up our hearts to realize the humble presence of God in our lives. In and through prayer we discover our true selves, the self that God has created each of us to be.

"Life in God should be a daring adventure of love but often we settle for mediocrity. We follow the daily practice of prayer but we are unwilling or, for various reasons, unable to give ourselves totally to God. To settle on the plain of mediocrity is to settle for something less than God, which leaves our hearts restless and unfulfilled.

"Prayer is that dynamic, life-giving relationship with God by which we grow deep in God's Word, strong in God's grace, and free in God's love to dream with God the unimaginable."

May our prayer this Lenten season help us to grow closer to God, and to His vision for us and for our community.
