

Lenten Regulations: Catholics ages 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent. The rule does not apply when health or ability ABSTINENCE to work would be seriously impacted. Catholics who have celebrated their

18th birthday, but have not yet marked their 59th are to fast on Good Friday. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to individual needs but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

PRAYER CORNER

A GLIMPSE OF GOD

Have you ever had a glimpse of God? Perhaps you perceived God's presence in a quiet moment of prayer, a tender conversation with a loved one, or a difficult situation that was resolved unexpectedly. Peter, James, and John in today's

Gospel were given a glimpse of Christ's glory on the mountain, as Jesus was transfigured before them. Abram put his faith in God and saw God's power in a wondrous sign of covenant love. We have the promise of eternal life with God in heaven. This promise brings with it responsibility, as people who are called to live as Christ's very own in the world. Lent is the perfect time to resolve to listen more attentively to the Lord and follow God's ways, assured that in doing so, we put our faith in the one, true, and faithful God.

2022 Archbishop's Annual Appeal Incarnation Parish

As Catholics in the Archdiocese of Hartford we have a profound impact on our local communities not only in the spiritual realm, but intimately connected to it, the realm of social services and many charities and outreach services performed by, or with help from, our Church. Theme is Stronger Together. Goal: \$135,000.

Pastor's Corner – March 13, 2022

While we are only just beginning the 2nd week of Lent, it is not too early to begin thinking about the end of Lent, namely the Holy Triduum – the three most solemn days in our church calendar. They are, after all, the very foundation of all we do as Catholic Christians: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (the Easter Vigil).

A little over a week ago, we invited you to join us in planning these liturgies. About twenty of you responded to that invitation and came for a long but very productive meeting. I began by sharing my dilemma. Even though we are still two separate parishes (for a couple more months), and can therefore have the Triduum in each of our churches, as pastor it is my obligation to preside at each of these liturgies for all of you each year. Not being able to bi-locate, I inquired of the Archdiocese how others in the same predicament were approaching this, and was told that I could have just one of each of the liturgies, but that they all did not need to all be celebrated in the same church.

And so the Liturgy Committee, along with Fr. Moran, Fr. Zach, and Deacon Michael decided to divide the Triduum this way – Holy Thursday will be at 7:00pm on April 14 at Corpus Christi Church; Good Friday at 3:00pm on April 15 at Incarnation Church; Holy Saturday at 8:00pm on April 16 at Corpus Christi Church.

Easter Sunday Masses will keep to our existing Sunday schedule: 8:30 and 10:30 at Incarnation and 8:00 and 10:15 at Christ the King.

We then discussed at length the different traditions of each of our parishes, and have blended them to form very beautiful liturgies for these days. This will give us an opportunity to come together as one to worship our Lord and God, to walk with Jesus through his Passion and Death, and then celebrate, together, his Resurrection, which gives to each and every one of us the hope and promise of a new and eternal life. Please mark your calendars now and plan on joining us in just a few weeks.

Lenten Giving Crosses Program: Are you looking for a little extra that you can do during Lent? The Social Action Committee is sponsoring the "Lenten Crosses" program, which offers suggestions you may want to include in your Lenten activities. Cards are available at Corpus Christi on the side ledges and at the entrances of Incarnation. The cards contain activities for you to complete during Lent, including prayer (green cards), fasting (yellow), children's ideas (blue), good works (pink) and make a donation (orange) to a number of different organizations. You can pick one or more cards and complete the activity during Lent. The cards do not need to be returned.

ENCOUNTER THE IMPORTANCE OF WORK FOR ALL

"We all need food to nourish us and keep us healthy. Without food, we find it hard to concentrate, study, do our work or even play. Jesus often shared meals with friends and even strangers, and he teaches us to be generous in sharing what we have to eat with others."

This week, we learn about Raúl and Lilian and their 2 sons in the village of Xequemeyá, Guatemala. In their village, malnutrition is high, which is especially dangerous for children. The community also struggles with water scarcity, poor education, poverty and a changing climate. Raúl and Lilian believe all this can be overcome, and as Raul says, "All things are achieved when one sets out to do so".

Lilian heard about Catholic Relief Services' SEGAMIL program and how they could receive agriculture training and nutrition education for their children. Raúl and Lilian learned how to manage and care for their crops. With this knowledge, they began growing their business and added onions, chili peppers and oranges to their crops. Produce was plentiful, but they continued to struggle in being able to sell it at markets. Still determined, they entered CRS' Nuestra Cosecha program that helped them register with the government to begin selling their produce to 16 local schools. Soon, they hired family and community members to harvest and pack the food. Today, they are proud to be able to help others in their community, especially children, to avoid malnutrition.

Let us reflect on the theme that work is important and is part of God's plan for adults and families. Why is it important to help others have work and an income?
