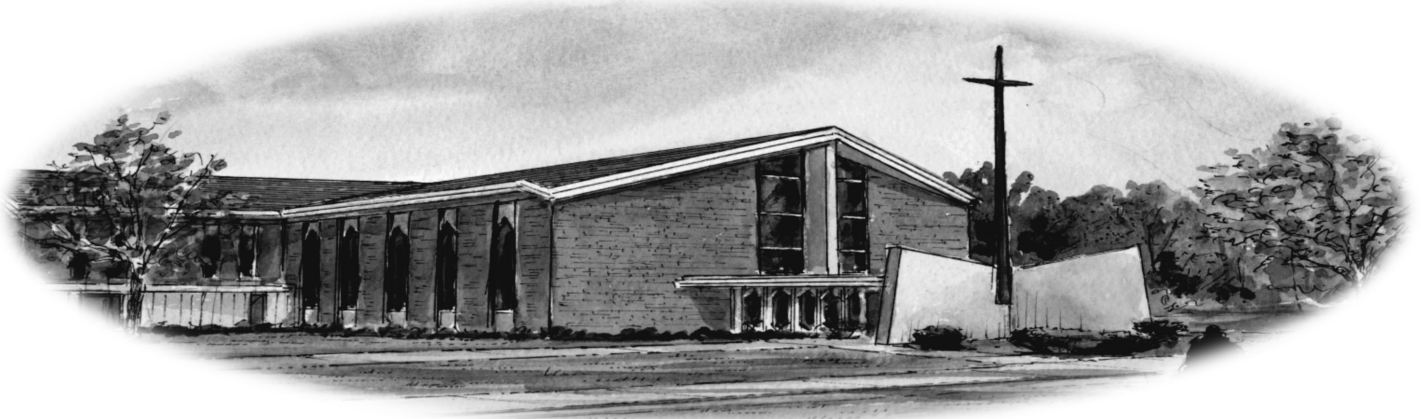

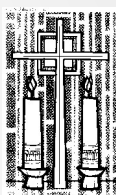

## **PRAYER CORNER**

### **GOD'S OVERFLOWING KINDNESS**

The superabundance of God's kindness ties all of today's readings together. Especially when life overwhelms us, the Lord provides all we need, and then some. In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter takes the lead when facing the Sanhedrin. We might expect the man who denied Jesus to crumble under the imposing glare of the high priest. Instead, the Holy Spirit helps him testify to his faith in Jesus Christ. What Peter had lacked before, courage and conviction, God provides in abundance. Similarly, today's Gospel shows Jesus providing a surplus of fish for the disciples. They have no luck fishing until the Lord intercedes. Jesus supplies an almost ridiculous number of fish, and he cooks it for them, too. As our reading from Revelation affirms, the overflowing riches of God require constant praise. Countless creatures—"everything in the universe"—cry out to honor the Lord, forever and ever.

**Pastor's Corner – May 1, 2022**

On this 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter, as we turn our calendars to the glorious month of May – Mary's month – and we continue to celebrate the Easter sacraments: three Saturdays of 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communions followed by one Saturday of Confirmation, I cannot help but feel the power of the Risen Christ at work here in our Catholic community of Wethersfield! Alleluia! Praise the Lord! Jesus IS Risen! What a God we have.

Fr. Richard Rohr writes about how all of this has one purpose, to connect us to everyone and everything else in the world around us.

“The God Jesus incarnates and embodies is not a distant God that must be placated. Jesus' God is not sitting on some throne demanding worship and throwing down thunderbolts like Zeus. Jesus never said, “Worship me”; he said, “Follow me.” He asks us to imitate him in his own journey of full incarnation. To do so, he gives us the two great commandments: (1) Love God with your whole heart, soul, mind, and strength and (2) Love your neighbor as yourself. In the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus shows us that our “neighbor” even includes our “enemy.”

“So how do we love God? Most of us seem to have concluded we love God by attending church services. For some reason, we think that makes God happy. I'm not sure why. Jesus never talked about attending services, although church can be a good container to start with. I believe our inability to recognize and love God in what is right in front of us has allowed us to separate religion from our actual lives. There is Sunday morning, and then there is real life.

“The only way I know how to teach anyone to love God, and how I myself seek to love God, is *to love what God loves*, which is everything and everyone, including you and including me! “We love because God first loved us”. “If we love one another, God remains in us, and God's love is brought to perfection in us”.

“Then we love with God's infinite love that can always flow through us. We are able to love things for themselves and in themselves—and not for what they do for us. That takes both work and surrender. As we get ourselves out of the way, there is a slow but real expansion of consciousness. We are not the central reference point anymore. We love in greater and greater circles until we can finally do what Jesus did: love and forgive even our enemies.”

**Care for our Environment:** On Friday, April 22nd, we celebrated Earth Day. “LAUDATO SI” – “Praise be to you, my Lord.” These are the words that open Pope Francis’ encyclical on ecology and care for God’s creation. These words, quoting St. Francis of Assisi’s beautiful canticle, remind us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us.

Pope Francis addresses Laudato Si’ to “every person on the planet,” for we all share a common home—the earth. He focuses on a number of important themes. Here are 3 of these themes:

□ **A Moral and Spiritual Challenge.** The ecological crisis, Pope Francis writes, is a summons to profound interior conversion—to renew our relationships with God, one another, and the created world.

□ **Care for God’s Creation.** God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it and all people, who are part of creation. Protecting human dignity is strongly linked to care for creation.

□ **We are All Connected.** We are connected to the rest of the human family, to the created world, and to those who will come after us in future generations.

**ImmaCare Shelter Sandwiches**

Sandwiches are distributed by ImmaCare in Hartford to people who don’t frequent shelters. If you are new to the sandwich collection, here is a guide.

\*Any type of bread may be used.

\*Two (2) slices of meat (such as ham, bologna, salami) & a slice of cheese per sandwich

\*About 1 pound of meat is needed per loaf of bread. Can vary ingredients if you don’t have enough of 1 kind to finish the loaf.

\*Please DO NOT put condiments or butter on the bread.

\*Peanut butter & jelly sandwiches are also very popular. Sandwiches are individually wrapped, put back in the bread wrapper, twist-tied, & placed in the box in the church foyer. We are grateful to the Middle School age students at Corpus Christi School who have been making over 300 sandwiches each month!

**Let’s dazzle the town with our May food donations!!!** Each year, our parish is one of the “Dazzling Dozen” organizations, congregations or businesses asked by the town of Wethersfield to promote increased donations for one month and contribute all food and other items collected to the town food bank.
