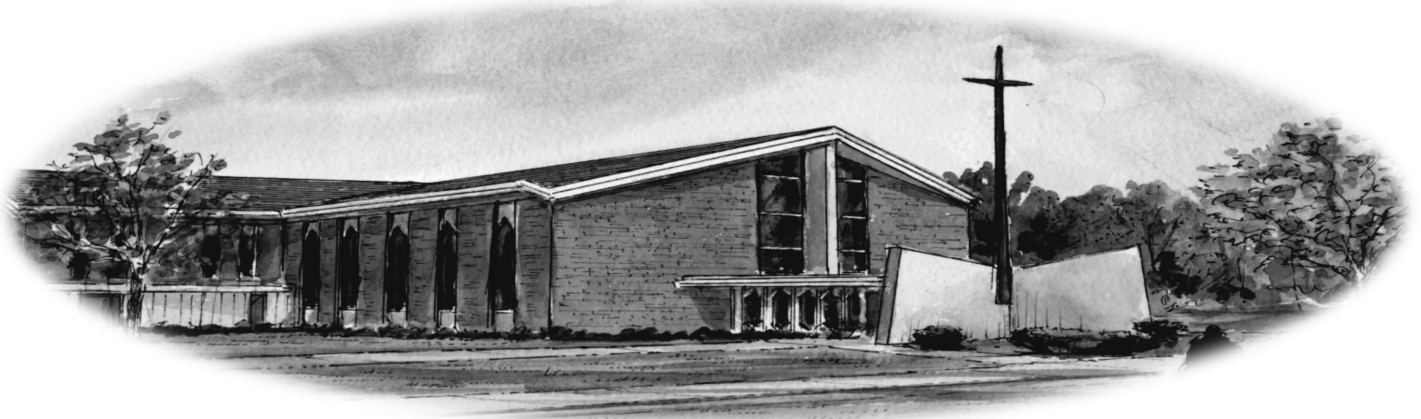

Archdiocese of Hartford Decree of Merging the following parishes;

Incarnation and Christ the King in Wethersfield, CT.

On June 1st, 2022, the parishes of Incarnation & Christ the King in Wethersfield will merge to form a new parish to be known as Christ the King Parish, in accordance with canons 121 & 515 §2 of the Code of Canon. On April 26th, 2022, Archbishop Leonard P. Blair issued a decree effecting the merger of the two parishes in Wethersfield, CT. The decree will be read at all Masses the weekend of May 7th & 8th, 2022 and posted at Incarnation Church, Christ the King Parish and Sacred Heart Church. It is also available on the Archdiocese of Hartford website, under the News/Public notices section, [<https://archdioceseofhartford.org/public-notice/>]. Canonical recourse may be made within the peremptory time limit of ten (10) days from the legitimate notification of the decree and in accordance with the norm of law (c. 1734 §2).

PRAYER CORNER

A FORETASTE OF PARADISE

Throughout Easter Time, the Church rejoices with Jesus, risen from the dead. Our readings on this Fourth Sunday of Easter celebrate our instinct to come together in joy, worshiping in church. While private prayer nourishes our individual relationship with the Lord, community prayer is a foretaste of paradise. The book of Revelation depicts a “great multitude” worshipping God “day and night in his temple.” Our churches on Easter Sunday often reflect this happy multitude, filling the pews to bursting. Four Sundays into the festive season, we are encouraged to keep praising God together. In the Acts of the Apostles, Paul and Barnabas demonstrate their instinct to worship with their faith community each Sabbath, dutifully taking their seats in the synagogue. In the Gospel, Jesus calls us his sheep and reminds us why coming together as a flock is so important: uniting in community, we imitate the unity of God.

Social Action Committee News

Please join us at our final meeting before the summer on Tues., May 17th at 7 pm in Christ the King's downstairs hall. Your help and ideas are always needed. We would love to have people from Incarnation get involved. The weekly food collection continues year round, as do rides to weekly Mass for two female visually handicapped parishioners and weekly shopping for one of the women. For May, since we are part of the Town's "Dazzling Dozen" and May is our assigned month, we are seeking an increase in the amount of food donated on a weekly basis. All food and items collected during May will be given to the Town of Wethersfield's food pantry to help stock them for the summer months and can be brought to the vestibule at CTK. The sandwich collection continues for ImmaCare, usually the first weekend of each month, unless there is a holiday and then the collection is the week after. Also, throughout the summer, a committee member will continue to pick up pastries weekly from Starbucks in Rocky Hill and deliver them to South Park Inn. St. Augustine's requested to postpone the Mass and meet and greet until the fall. The last shelter meal until the fall is May 11th. 250 "Blessing Bags" for the homeless will be assembled in June. Our efforts regarding human trafficking continue all year, with monthly prayer groups and 5 of us becoming mentors for victims of trafficking. Also continuing is our continued involvement with GHIAA, The Greater Hartford Interfaith Action Alliance. ImmaCare Shelter Sandwiches

The Social Action Committee at Christ the King Parish is collecting sandwiches at Masses this weekend, May 7th/8th. Please bring the sandwiches to the vestibule at Christ the King.

Sandwiches are distributed by ImmaCare in Hartford to people who don't frequent shelters. If you are new to the sandwich collection, here is a guide.

*Any type of bread may be used.

*Two (2) slices of meat (such as ham, bologna, salami) & a slice of cheese per sandwich

*About 1 pound of meat is needed per loaf of bread. Can vary ingredients if you don't have enough of 1 kind to finish the loaf.

*Please DO NOT put condiments or butter on the bread.

*Peanut butter & jelly sandwiches are also very popular. Sandwiches are individually wrapped, put back in the bread wrapper, twist-tied, & placed in the box in the church foyer. We are grateful to the Middle School age students at Corpus Christi School who have been making over 300 sandwiches each month!

We Are One With God's Creation

Caring for the earth is a requirement of our faith, not just an Earth Day slogan. Everything that we consume: air, water, paper, wood, energy, and food, comes from the earth. Our lives are shaped by creation, and how we use natural resources has a tremendous impact on whether creation thrives or suffers. All of creation is interdependent. Soils, oceans, grasslands, forests, insects, birds, and animals all depend on each other to survive "God wills the interdependence of creatures, the sun and the moon, the cedar and the little flower, the eagle and the sparrow. Creatures exist only in dependence on each other, to complete each other, in the service of each other." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #340).

Here is a Prayer for God's Creation: "God of all creation, we walk the earth as holy ground and gaze at the sky as a sacred canopy. Flowering plants, towering trees, earthworms, land animals, and the birds of the air are the works of your fingers and sing of your glory. Planets and moons, stars, and galaxies praise you. The water we drink and the food we eat are gifts of your goodness. We pray that we may stretch our minds to see all creation as one, brothers and sisters to us, manifestations of your glory." Amen.
