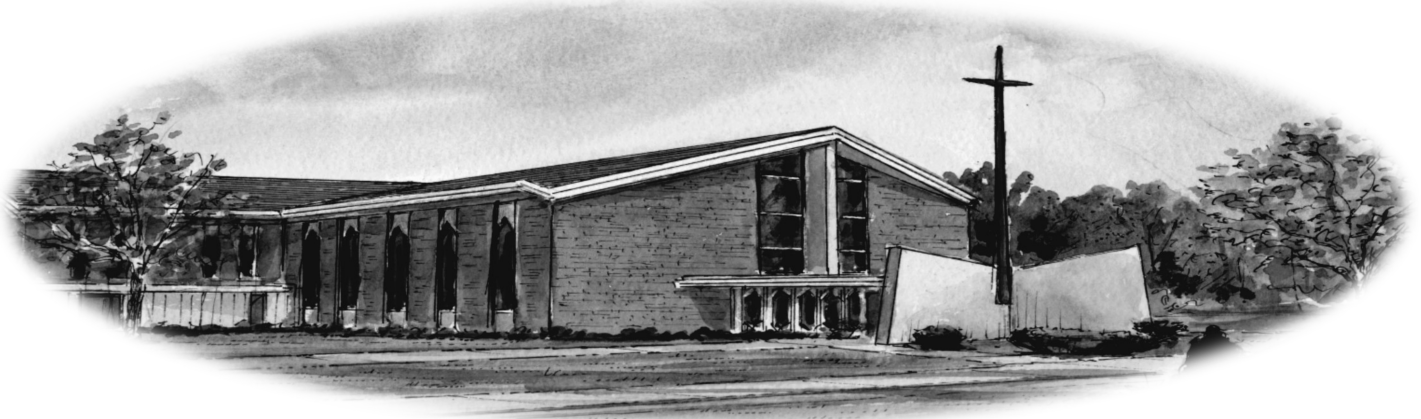

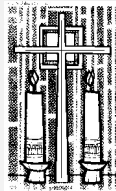

Archdiocese of Hartford Decree of Merging the following parishes;

Incarnation and Christ the King in Wethersfield, CT.

On June 1st, 2022, the parishes of Incarnation & Christ the King in Wethersfield will merge to form a new parish to be known as Christ the King Parish, in accordance with canons 121 & 515 §2 of the Code of Canon. On April 26th, 2022, Archbishop Leonard P. Blair issued a decree effecting the merger of the two parishes in Wethersfield, CT. The decree will be read at all Masses the weekend of May 7th & 8th, 2022 and posted at Incarnation Church, Christ the King Parish and Sacred Heart Church. It is also available on the Archdiocese of Hartford website, under the News/Public notices section,

Canonical recourse may be made within the peremptory time limit of ten (10) days from the legitimate notification of the decree and in accordance with the norm of law (c. 1734 §2).

Nurses---Wingless Angels!

The month of May is dedicated to Mother Mary and is also named International Nurses' Week which is May 6 through 12.

"A Nurse is one who opens the eye of a newborn and gently closes the eye of a dying man. It is indeed a high blessing to be the first and the last to witness the beginning and the end of life" Unknown.

Mother May was a nurse who traveled to the hill country of Judea to assist the expectant Elizabeth, the mother of John the baptizer. The Good Samaritan was another male nurse who assisted the wounded man in the middle of nowhere. He did everything within his capacity to heal the wounded wayfarer and restore his health.

Thousands of nurses all over died in the line of duty, making the ultimate sacrifice in attending and caring for the victims of an 'invisible tsunami', Covid -19. The world Nurses Union says that more than 1700 U.S. healthcare workers have died from Covid-19. "Save one life, you are a hero. Save 100 lives, you are a nurse" Unknown. Undoubtedly, they are the brave warriors!!

My experience as a full time chaplain from 2014-2019 was quite an experience. Visiting the terminally ill patients was my first priority. Once a very dedicated nurse, working in one of the facilities, called me to anoint a dying inmate who was condemned for life. He was a hard hearted man who never believed in God. Thanks to the effort and tender care and love of the nurse, he was converted and desired to receive the sacrament of healing. That same day the inmate died. I can still remember the sadness of the nurse who wept inconsolably. "When you are a nurse, you know every day you will touch a life or a life will touch you". "Nurse is just another word to describe a person strong enough to tolerate anything and soft enough to understand anyone" Unknown. "Have a heart that never hardens, a temper that never tires, a touch that never hurts" Charles Dickens.

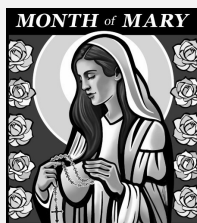

MAKING ALL THINGS NEW

Although we are five full weeks into the celebration of Easter, today's readings focus on newness. Our Easter food leftovers may be long gone, but the readings insist on every moment's freshness in the risen Jesus. The Acts of the Apostles depicts Paul and Barnabas reflecting on all the innovative work that God has done with them. They have traveled hundreds of miles, introducing faith in Jesus Christ to all who listen, even Gentiles. For the dutiful Jewish scholar Paul, preaching to Gentiles is a completely unique development. Jesus calls Paul, and us, not to be afraid of new challenges: as John the Evangelist reports in Revelation, Jesus promises to "make all things new." In the Gospel reading, Jesus even gives us a new commandment. The Hebrew Scriptures overflow with commandments, but Jesus knows we need one more, perfect mission: "love one another."

Pastor's Corner – May 15, 2022



As was announced last weekend with the reading of the Decree promulgated by Archbishop Blair, the merger of Incarnation and Christ the King Parishes will become effective on June 1st. At that time we will all be part of Christ the King Parish. I am deeply grateful for the assistance in this process given by the members of our Transition Team.

If you wish to read the Decree in its entirety, it can be found posted outside Incarnation, Corpus Christi and Sacred Heart churches, and it can be found under the News/Public Notices section of the diocesan website at <https://archdioceseofhartford.org/public-notices/>. There are a lot of legalities both in canon law and civil law that are being attended to, and this is one of the church law requirements.

On June 5th, the Church will celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the official end of the Easter season and the birth of the Church. It, quite appropriately, will be our first weekend as a merged parish, and so that deserves a special celebration. So, in addition to praying for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to be poured out upon us as a new Catholic community here in Wethersfield, we will have a Parish Picnic. It will begin at 11:30 am on the grounds of Incarnation church. It is free of charge, but we ask for people to register so that we can have enough food for all.

This season of Easter is one of new life, given to us by the Resurrection of Jesus, our Lord and Savior. I love this time of year, because as I watch nature 'come back to life' again with the special spring colors that never seem to last very long, I feel inside of me as I celebrate the three Easter sacraments in our Church that same hope and joy. Last weekend we concluded three weekends of 1st Holy Communion, yesterday we celebrated with our young adults at the Cathedral as they were confirmed in the faith, and every weekend we welcome new members through the holy sacrament of Baptism! What a beautiful time of the year it is indeed! Alleluia!

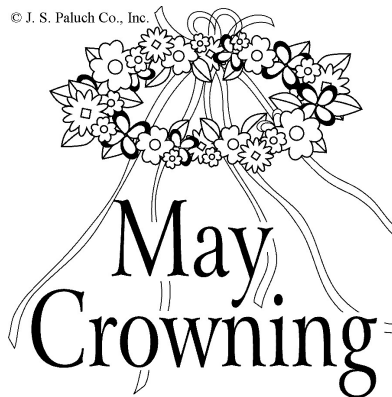
