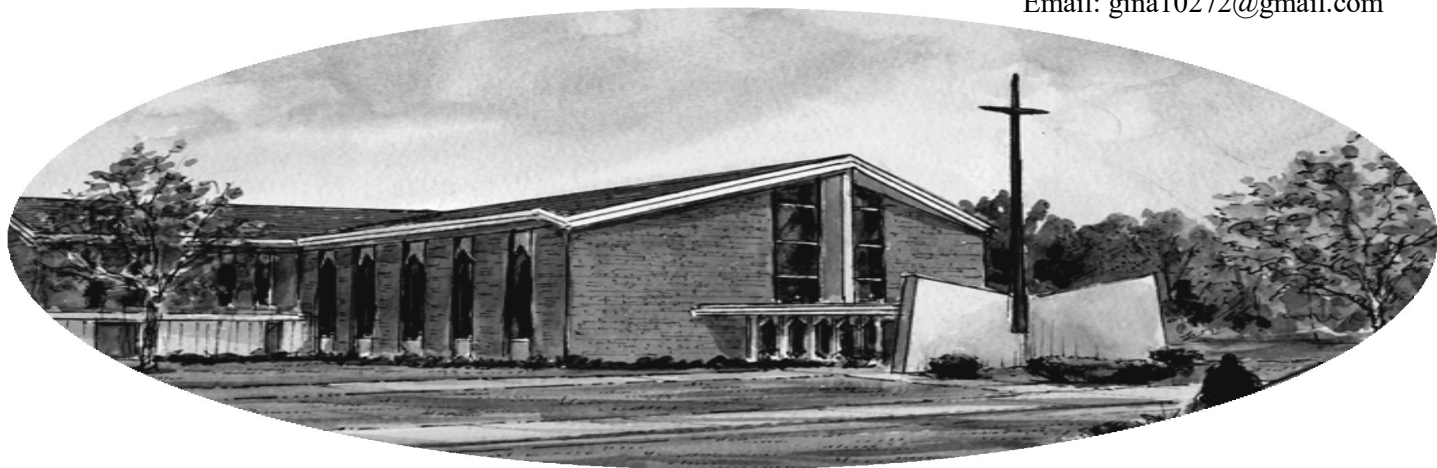

Archdiocese of Hartford Decree of Merging the following parishes;

Incarnation and Christ the King in Wethersfield, CT.

On June 1st, 2022, the parishes of Incarnation & Christ the King in Wethersfield will merge to form a new parish to be known as Christ the King Parish, in accordance with canons 121 & 515 §2 of the Code of Canon. On April 26th, 2022, Archbishop Leonard P. Blair issued a decree effecting the merger of the two parishes in Wethersfield, CT. The decree was read at all Masses May 7th & 8th, 2022 and posted at Incarnation Church, Christ the King Parish and Sacred Heart Church. It is also available on the Archdiocese of Hartford website, under the News/Public notices section, [<https://archdioceseofhartford.org/public-notice/>]. Canonical recourse may be made within the peremptory time limit of ten (10) days from the legitimate notification of the decree and in accordance with the norm of law (c. 1734 §2).

The Feast of Pentecost: This Saturday, June 4th at the 5pm Mass & Sunday, June 5th at the 8:30am and 10:30am Masses at Incarnation, members of our faith community will offer the petitions of the Universal Prayer in their ethnic language representing the Spirit's Gift of Tongues.

On a hot summer day, I was having lunch with the school kids of the village, when a group of poachers came to that place for entrapping the most beautiful and exotic 'red-headed Cardenales'. The school teacher, along with the children and some elders prevented them from capturing those birds. It's a pleasure to watch the birds gather in large numbers during lunch time to feed on breadcrumbs the kids provide them.

On another occasion, in India, a ruthless hunter shot and wounded a crow just for sport. Once again, I could witness the love and kindness of the little school kids who tried to revive the mortally wounded crow but in vain. "The human animal is not the only being on earth who possesses the ability to express love and emotion" "Our goal is not just an environment of clean air and water and scenic beauty. The objective is an environment of decency, quality and mutual respect for all other human beings and all other living creatures".

THE SPIRIT'S ACTIVE POWER

The mystery of the Trinity refers to one God in three persons. We frequently acknowledge Jesus as “the second person of the Trinity,” but referring also to the Spirit as a “person” comes less naturally. In religious art, the Holy Spirit often appears as a dove or, as in today’s reading from the Acts of the Apostles, tongues of fire. Much rarer are images of the Spirit as a “person” in recognizable human form. Today’s readings do not settle the issue of how to picture the Spirit, but they certainly give shape to the Spirit’s active power in the world and in each human heart. In Acts, the Spirit enables people to speak and understand a variety of languages. Paul’s letter to the Corinthians praises the Spirit for all kinds of spiritual gifts, services, and “workings.” Finally, in John’s Gospel, Jesus calls the Spirit our Advocate and our divine teacher.

Pastor's Corner – June 5, 2022

As we enter into Ordinary Time once again in our liturgical year, it is important to remember that the process of living out our baptismal promises is a life-long process, and does not end just because Easter has concluded. Jesus sent us the Paraclete, the Helper, the Holy Spirit to enable us to continue to build his Kingdom.

Fr. Richard Rohr shares the view of Brian McLaren (author, speaker, theologian) who invites us to heed the words of the prophet Micah:

“O human being, this is what God desires for you. That you do justice. That you love kindness. That you walk humbly in the presence of your God.

“Micah”, he says, “turns a religious question into a human question.

Christians very much like to call Jesus the ‘Son of God’. Jesus preferred to call himself the ‘Son of Man’. There are many layers of meaning to the term. But the simplest and most obvious is this: a son of humanity is a human being. If you want to put a finer point on it, ‘son of’ means ‘the essence of’ or perhaps, ‘a new generation of’.

“Jesus is saying that he represents the essence of humanity, a new generation of humanity, a new kind of human being. In this light, his constant invitation, ‘follow me’, means ‘imitate me’ and ‘join me on my journey toward a new way of being human’.

“In that light, I hope you will aspire to be a humble human being – religiously.

“I hope you will desire to be a kind human being, because, that person you call your enemy - that person is part of your family, part of your species, part of your story, part of your kind.

“And in addition to being a humble and kind human being, I hope you will aspire to being a just human being. Don’t seek power over others to control or exploit them or harm them. Instead, use whatever power that comes your way for the common good, so that all people everywhere can share equal justice and equal dignity. Seek justice. Love justice. Do justice. Be a just human being - religiously.

“When I say religiously, I mean intentionally, seeking out practices that promote justice, kindness, and humility. And I mean collaboratively, joining or building communities or networks that promote those practices.”

As we begin our first week as the new Christ the King Parish, my prayer for all of us is that we will come together to do just that here in Wethersfield – joining together to do the work of Jesus, meeting the needs of all those around us, knowing we are all brothers and sisters walking the exact same journey.

Social Action Committee News

Caring for creation by recycling our resources (Part 2)

As Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si'* reminds us, God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. God charges us to be stewards of this gift. That means learning to recognize and move beyond the "throwaway culture" that has grown into our daily lives. Last week's bulletin notice covered curbside recycling; this notice will cover some less frequent but common stewardship challenges.

Old computers, TVs, and other electronics: Bring these to the Town of Wethersfield transfer station on Marsh Street (hours: M-F 9:00-2:45, Sat. 8:00-3:45).

Paint (oil or latex): Two nearby retailers (Ring's End and Sherwin Williams) take old paint (oil or latex) in cans. No spray cans, or leaking, unlabeled or empty containers.

Furniture: Many options here: Ends2Meet (<https://www.facebook.com/Ends2meet/>) is a terrific local volunteer group that picks up and distributes good-condition furniture to local people in need. The Salvation Army store on the Berlin Turnpike in Newington takes donations of good-condition furniture, and also has a pick-up service for furniture and other items (<https://satruck.org/schedule-pickup>). The Goodwill store on Main Street in Glastonbury also takes furniture donations. (The Goodwill store in Rocky Hill no longer does, due to limited store space.)

Sandwich Collection June 4th & 5th

The monthly sandwich collection for ImmaCare, Inc's Outreach Program is this weekend, June 4th & 5th. There is a great need for sandwiches throughout the summer months. Thank you very much to everyone who makes sandwiches. We give special thanks to the higher grades at Corpus Christi School, who continue to make 300+ sandwiches each month. The following is the guide on how to make them:

- Any type of bread may be used.
- Two (2) slices of meat (such as ham, bologna, salami) & a slice of cheese per sandwich
- About one pound of meat is needed for a loaf of bread. You can vary the ingredients if you don't have enough of one kind to finish the loaf.
- Please DO NOT put condiments or butter on the bread.
- Peanut butter & jelly sandwiches are also very popular.

Sandwiches are individually wrapped, put back in the bread wrapper, twist-tied, and placed in the box in the church foyer at Christ the King.

Rochelle Ripley, has worked with love and passion for the Hawkwing organization for many years. It all started with a promise she made to her grandmother to help Native Americans. They have a high suicide rate in this reservation and are rampant in poverty with high struggles for survival due to unemployment and other aspects of low income and life events. Hawkwing, provides help and support through the grace and aide of our community.
