

WORD TO THE FAITHFUL

Pastor's Corner – July 3, 2022

How good to be the chosen ones! As the United States celebrates Independence Day, we think back to colonial preachers who described their American venture in biblical terms, calling our early settlements "a new Israel, chosen by God". Abraham Lincoln told the nation that we were "conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal."

In hindsight, we realize that those ideals, like so many human endeavors, were as flawed as they were lofty. The founders' dream of equality applied to white males. The image of being a new Israel was corroded from the start by the fact that instead of fleeing slavery, early settlers bought and sold slaves and treated the Native Americans and their cultures with contempt — all for their own gain.

It's easy to think that God is with us when we win anything from wars to ballgames but our Scriptures challenge us every time we promote an image of God leading the conquerors.

On this Fourth of July weekend, Paul's letter to the Galatians, nicknamed the 'gospel of Christian

freedom', challenges us with an image of power and glory that undercuts all sorts of pride. Paul says: "May I never boast of anything but the cross."

According to Paul, no attempt at virtue can make us worthy of God's love and grace; those are ours, free and unmerited. God took flesh to identify humbly with us, while we seek a God who conforms to our ideals of power and might.

That is why Jesus sent his disciples to serve, equipped with nothing more than the Gospel message of the reign of God. They were to demonstrate that the reign of love is the only future worth working for and the only one that will last.

In order for the disciples to understand the message they were preaching, Jesus insisted that their gift to others be couched in poverty. They were to go as missionaries without money or provisions; they needed bed and board at the same time as they sought new homes for their message. To everyone's amazement, their mission succeeded.

What are we to take from these readings on this holiday weekend?

We need to pay attention to how countercultural our Gospel is. We may live in the "most powerful nation on earth," but the might of our country has very little to do with the vulnerable, non-coercive character of divine power.

Jesus sent his disciples out without snack packs, credit cards or hotel reservations. Likewise, we too are called to give humble witness to the Gospel of peacemaking, solidarity and justice for the marginalized in a society filled with violence, individualism and private privilege.

Suddenly, being chosen begins to sound more dangerous than special.

Like our ancestors, we are called in spite of our flaws. But if we remember who has chosen us, we won't need to worry about the wolves.

Social Action Committee News

Help needed for Human Trafficking Survivors

5 of us from the Social Action Committee are now part of the Care/Support Program through a joint partnership of The Underground New England & The Office for Catholic Social Justice Ministry (OCSJM) of the Archdiocese of Hartford. We are the first congregation and first group to be part of this program to pray for and indirectly help meet the needs of human trafficking survivors through their mentor, who works for The Underground.

For this month, we have received requests from the mentor for prayers and items needed for three survivors so far. The five of us can meet a number of the requests on our own, but we can really use some help to fulfill the remaining bigger requests. Here are the requests that we can use help with, which will always include specific prayer requests that anyone can do:

Survivor #1, female: Recently got her own apartment & walks 2 hours to get a bus, which then takes her 2 more hours to get to her job by bus, one way. She cannot afford to repair her car, which would greatly shorten her travel time to & from work. We are waiting to learn the approx. cost of car repairs. Money to repair the car is greatly needed. To donate any funds, please put the money or check (made out to CTK Social Action, with "survivor 1" in the memo line) & put in collection basket at either church. The 5 of us are providing a portable A/ C unit for her apartment & a gift card to purchase dress clothes for interviewing.

Prayers: For job opportunities/a new job (retail) that is close to where she lives/positive interviews for interview process.

Survivor #2, male: He just moved into his own apartment & is in need of a dresser, small hutch & small flat screen TV. Our team of 5 will meet the other needs of a tool box, tools, an area rug, a bath mat, and a small coat rack for the wall.

Prayers: For strength as he juggles his very full schedule of work/school.

Survivor #3, female: Recently moved from temporary housing into an apartment with her Emotional Support Animal (ESA), who needs training. She is incredibly excited about having her own place, decorating it, & hanging her own art on the walls, but she's overwhelmed by all of the work ahead of her, as she works on her health, school and a job.

Another need: She is very crafty and artistic and would like a sewing machine.

Our team of five is providing Walmart gift cards, so she can purchase food because she is not on SNAP benefits yet through the state.

Prayer Requests: Peace, calm & structure as she figures out how to balance her schedule. Resources for training her ESA. She's had to remove someone from her life, and it's been very painful. Sandwich Collection July 2nd & 3rd:

The monthly sandwich collection for ImmaCare, Inc's Outreach Program is this weekend. Sandwiches are needed even more during the summer. Thank you to ALL who donated sandwiches in the past! The following is a guide on how to make them:

- Any type of bread may be used.
- 2 slices meat (ham/salami/ bologna/& a slice of cheese per sandwich
- About one pound of meat is needed for a loaf of bread. You can vary the ingredients if you don't have enough of one kind to finish the loaf.
- DO NOT put condiments/butter on the bread.
- Peanut butter & jelly sandwiches are also very popular.

Sandwiches are individually wrapped, put back in the bread wrapper, twisttied, and placed in the box in the church foyer at Christ the King.
