WORD TO THE FAITHFUL

Pastor's Corner – August 7, 2022

As we continue to grow together as Christ the King Parish, we – myself included – are finding out just how hard it can be. This is not uncommon. In fact, it is normal because of human nature. Last week I shared with you the wisdom and words of Benedictine Sister Joan Chittister. Today I share how Thomas Merton recognized this same paradox at the heart of what we think of as "salvation": "We cannot find ourselves within ourselves, but only in others, yet at the same time before we can go out to others we must first find ourselves. We must forget ourselves in order to become truly conscious of who we are. The best way to love ourselves is to love others, yet we cannot love others unless we love ourselves since it is written, "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself" [Mark 12:31].

But if we love ourselves in the wrong way, we become incapable of loving anybody else. "The only effective answer to the problem of salvation must therefore reach out to embrace both extremes of a contradiction.

"Only when we see ourselves in our true human context, as members of a race which is intended to be one organism and "one body," will we begin to understand the positive importance not only of the successes but of the failures and accidents in our lives. My successes are not my own. The way to them was prepared by others. The fruit of my labors is not my own: for I am preparing the way for the achievements of another.

"Every other human is a piece of myself, for I am a part and a member of humankind. What I do is also done for them and with them and by them. What they do is done in me and by me and for me. But each one of us remains responsible for our own share in the life of the whole body." And thus we continue to pray Fr Richard Rohr's *Prayer For Our Community*, asking the Lord to continue to bless us with a greater awareness of the needs of those around us, how we can, together meet these needs, and for the grace to avoid those things that would resist working to become the best we can be.

Sandwich Collection August 6/7:

The monthly sandwich collection for ImmaCare, Inc's Outreach Program is this weekend. Sandwiches are greatly needed all year, but especially in the summer.

Thank you to everyone who has donated sandwiches in the past. The following is the guide:

• Any type of bread may be used.

Two (2) slices of meat (such as ham, bologna, salami) & a slice of cheese per sandwich

Approx. one pound of meat is needed for a loaf of bread. You can vary the ingredients if you don't have enough of one kind to finish the loaf.

- Please DO NOT put condiments or butter on the bread.
- Peanut butter/jelly sandwiches are popular. Sandwiches are individually wrapped, put in bread wrapper, twist-tied & placed in box in church foyer at Christ the King.

Weekly Food Drive

The weekly food drive continues through the summer & food can be brought to any Mass at Corpus Christi Church and put in the box in the vestibule. There is an urgent need for white rice in small bags/boxes, sugar & salt. Foodshare has not delivered these items lately to Wethersfield town's food bank & their shelves are bare. We are all feeling the rising costs of goods/services and this is felt profoundly on those with less means. If you are able to help, the food bank also greatly needs instant oatmeal packets, jelly, baked beans, pancake mix, canned ravioli, instant mashed potatoes, Ramen noodles, peanut butter/cheese crackers, granola & breakfast bars.
